ADMISSION PROCESS

Admissions to undergraduate (UG) programs at the University of Delhi are merit-based (that is, based on marks scored in Class XII Board/qualifying examinations) or entrance-based (that is, based on written/practical tests depending on the program selected by an aspiring student).

- 1. All Candidates must register through the University of Delhi online admissions portal www.admission.uod.ac.in.
- **2.** All undergraduate admissions for 2021-22 will be administered only through Delhi University portal.
- **3.** There is no offline admission for any Candidate.
- **4.** Only eligible Candidates who have registered online through the university portal can be considered for admission.
- **5.** Candidates will be required to appear in person for verification of their original documents, as and when notified by the University/College.
- **6.** All admission procedures are to be completed by the Candidate using the unique login ID they create on the Delhi University Undergraduate admissions portal.

Undergraduate programs are offered by the University through its colleges in various streams of studies. Candidates must check eligibility criteria thoroughly to see whether they satisfy the requirements or not. Admission to various programs is made through the various criteria and procedures specified by the University in the Bulletin of Information 2021-22.

Undergraduate Merit based Admission Process

Step I: Registration on the UG portal.

The Candidate uses the university UG Admissions portal to create their personal username and password, fills in their registration form, chooses their programs of interest, and uploads the required documents. The Candidates must exercise extreme care in filling up their form. Much of the information entered by the Candidates into the form will not be allowed to edit and correct after submission of the form.

- 1. All the candidates seeking admission to the Undergraduate (UG) programs are required to register online.
- 2. Any first time user, in order to access UG Admission Portal, need to register on the portal with a valid e-mail ID (email ID once registered on Portal can't be used for any other registration for admission in DU).
- 3. Candidates who do not have a valid e-mail ID must create an e-mail ID before proceeding.
- 4. The Candidate needs to keep this e-mail ID handy because it will be required to access

his/her account on the portal as well as for all the future correspondence throughout the admission process and subsequent to admission process also

- 5. The default settings allow all Candidates to register for all programs (without any penalties).
- 6. The Candidates will be eligible to take admission in all the colleges and programs provided they satisfy the cut-off of the colleges and the eligibility for the selected programs.
- 7. If Candidates have examination results pending or have reappeared in papers, they will be able to update these marks by logging into their Dashboards till the last 3 days before the date of admissions in the University (as and when notified by the University of Delhi)
- 8. Utmost care must be exercised in uploading the documents. Candidates will need scanned copies of the certificates on the basis of which they wish to claim admission
 - (a) Class X certificate
 - (b) Class XII certificate
 - (c) Relevant reservation certificate issued by competent issuing authority
 - (d) Self attested copies of requisite certificates for admission under sports/ ECA Ouota.
 - (e) Link of the uploaded clip for admission against music
 - (f) Photo identity card (Aadhar Card, Driving License, PAN Card, Voter Identity Card, Passport or School Identity Card)
- 9. Candidates will be responsible for all the information they upload, including copies of certificates. They will also be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the files they upload. The Candidates will be able to see the preview of their form and the uploaded documents. The Candidates are advised to take all care to avoid rejection on this basis during the admission process.

Step II: Payment of the registration fees

The registration form will be deemed submitted only after realization of the relevant registration fee. This fee must be paid only through the link provided through the Candidate's Dashboard. There is no method available to Candidates other than this online link generated for payment of the registration fee. When the Candidate has successfully submitted the registration fee online, they are advised to keep records of the payment's transaction ID, Credit Card/ Debit card/ Netbanking details and date of transaction as proof for future reference. Further, the Candidates are advised to complete the process well before the deadline in order to avoid any last minute glitches. For guidelines related to cut offs and other admission related announcements, keep checking the DU website (www.admission.uod.ac.in) on regular basis. If at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto.

Eligibility Criteria for Undergraduate Programs

- 1. The Candidate must be a citizen of India. (Candidates seeking admission under the Foreign Students' category to apply separately on Foreign Students' Registry website, http://fsr.du.ac.in.)
- 2. The Candidate should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/ University examination in India or in any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- 3. The Candidate should have "passed" individually in each subject required (including practicals if any) for calculating merit and eligibility to the program they seek admission in.
- 4. Candidates with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for the purpose of admission to undergraduate programs.
- 5. Candidates under the UR/SC/ST/OBC/EWS categories are eligible to seek admission based on both merit and entrance tests to programs.
- 6. The following categories are designated —supernumerary: i) PwBD (Persons with Benchmark Disabilities); ii) CW (Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces including Para-Military); iii) KM (Kashmiri Migrants); iv) Prime Minister's special scholarship for Jammu and Kashmir; v) SS (Nominated Sikkimese Students); vi) WQ (Ward Quota); vii) ECA (Extra-Curricular Activities); viii) Sports. Note: Above mentioned categories i –viii are applicable to programs where admission is based on merit only. For programs where admission is based on entrance tests, Candidates belonging to categories i, ii and vi only are entitled to admission.

The Candidates shall be required to upload copies of the following certificates/documents at the time of registration and produce the documents in original at the time of physical verification at the end of the admissions process.

1. Class X Certificate (Mark-sheet or certificate) indicating date of birth and Parents' names (The names of Candidates claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM must match with the names that appear on the corresponding reservation certificates; similarly their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).

2. Class XII Marksheet.

- 3. **SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM Certificate** (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent authority. (The names of Candidates claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/ KM must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).
- 4. **OBC** (**Non-Creamy Layer**) **Certificate** (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC central list issued by http://ncbc.nic.in. (The name of the Candidate claiming reservation under OBC (Non Creamy Layer) must match with the Candidate's name as it appears on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates). Income certificate for the financial year 2020-21, dated on or after March 31, 2021, as stipulated, will be required.

- 5. EWS Certificate from competent authority certifying the Candidate can claim reservation under this category. (The names of Candidates claiming reservation under this category must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates). Income certificate for the financial year 2020-21, dated on or after March 31, 2021, as stipulated, will be required.
- 6. Any Candidates claiming admission through ECA/Sports categories must upload self-attested copies of the requisite certificates/produce the relevant required certificates when sought as stipulated in the UG Bulletin of Information 2021-22 issued by the University of Delhi.

Candidates shall be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the images they upload at the time of registration. Candidates must take care to ensure that uploads are authentic and accurate. Candidates will be responsible for production of documents as sought. All certificates/documents will be returned to the Candidate by the College/Department upon completion of any physical verification that may be required at a later stage.


<u>Admission Process</u>: There is Common Entrance Examination conducted by the Department of Education, Delhi University, comprising a written test for the B.El.Ed programme.

Rules and Procedure for Registration, Entrance Exam and Allotment of Colleges

- At the time of filling the application form, all applicants are required to fill their order of preference of college in their online application form. The applicant has to choose a college in front of each preference in the registration form.
- Allotment of colleges to the applicants shall be based on the marks obtained in the entrance examination by the applicant and her order of preference of college, subject to the availability of seats in that particular college.
- The College preferences submitted by the eligible candidate during online registration shall be processed centrally for all the rounds of counselling/allotment in an automated manner. The seats available in each college shall be allotted provisionally in order of merit and preferences given by the candidate for all the categories separately till all the seats category wise in the particular college are exhausted.
- Only those candidates who have appeared in the Entrance Test and satisfy the minimum eligibility criteria will be considered for admission during the process.
- If a candidate is allotted a seat on the basis of her best preference, then she will not be allowed to change to any lower preference in the category.

Steps for Online Admissions in B.El.Ed



- **Step 1:** The allotment-cum-merit list shall be displayed on the UG Admission portal as well as display of allocated college on the applicant's dashboard on the admission portal.
- **Step 2:** The applicant is required to login to the UG Admission Portal using their registered email and password. The allotted course (and college) shall be displayed. In case the applicant wishes to get admission to the displayed course, the applicant is required to click on the "Apply for Admission" button provided.
- **Step 3:** The college/institution shall check the eligibility and certificates uploaded by the candidate during office hours within the stipulated time and approve the admission if these are found satisfactory. The college/institution staff may contact the applicant over email or phone in case of any queries.
- **Step 4:** On receiving approval for admission by the Principal, the applicant is required to submit the college fee online within the stipulated time allotted for the purpose. Failure to pay the fee shall lead to cancellation of the allotted seat. Applicants already admitted in a course at the University of Delhi shall be required to cancel admission in such course and pay cancellation fee in order to be eligible.
- **Step 5:** The admitted students shall be required to present themselves with their original documents for verification at the time of commencement of classes or as per the directions issued by the college/institution.

Documents Required: After the allotment of college, candidates should present self-attested photostat copies of:

- Certificate of having passed 12th examination and the marks obtained therein
- Certificate of birth
- Documentary proof of special categories

Admission Related Frequently asked Questions

1. How many UG courses are offered at Institute of Home Economics (IHE)?

Ans. IHE offers the following seven UG courses:

- (i) BSc. (Hons.) Home Science
- (ii) BSc. (Pass) Home Science
- (iii) BSc. (Hons.) Microbiology
- (iv) BSc. (Hons.) Biochemistry
- (v) BSc. (Hons.) Food Technology
- (vi) BA (Hons.) Journalism
- (vii) Bachelor of Elementary Education.

2. If I have done my XII from Humanities, can I still apply for BSc (Hons.) Home Science?

Ans. Basic eligibility for admission in Home Science (Hons.) requires at least anyone subject from Science stream (Physics, Chemistry and Biology/ Biochemistry/ Biotechnology).

3. Do we include English in Best of 4 for Hons. Course in Science.

Ans. For BSc.(Hons.) Home Science, BSc.(Hons.) Microbiology, BSc. (Hons.) Biochemistry, BSc. (Hons.) Food Technology we use the best of three subjects in which English or any other language is not included. Although you must have studied English during class XII and should have scored at least 50% in the same.

4. I am from the Science stream. Can I also apply for BSc. (Pass) Home Science?

Ans. Yes, you can apply. We consider the Best 4 subjects for BSc. (Pass) Home Science including English and combination of the best three subjects from List B.

5. In which situations will my marks be deducted with 2.5%?

Ans. If the applicant includes subjects other than those given in Lists A and B, then a deduction of 2.5% of maximum marks will be levied for each such subject for the purpose of calculating 'Best Four'

6. For B.A (Hons) Journalism, I want to include mass media as a subject in Best four. Will my marks be deducted by 2.5%?

Ans. For B.A (Hons) Journalism English and a combination of the best three subjects from List A, List B, and Mass Media Studies will be considered without deducting 2.5%.

7. Is an income certificate required with a valid OBC-NCL certification?

Ans. No, income certificate is not required with a valid OBC-NCL certification.

8. Is a state caste certificate applicable for taking admission in DU?

Ans. For claiming reservation under SC or ST quota, a certificate from the state is valid for admission. But in the case of OBC's, a certificate from the state is not valid, only those castes that are in the **Central OBC** list are eligible for admission in DU. OBC's also have to ensure they have the latest 'non-creamy layer' certificate.

9. Can I still apply for a DU admission while my caste certificate is in the process?

Ans. Yes, you can apply but at the time of admission, you have to produce the certificate.

10. We don't have a caste certificate. Is it possible to get admission?

Ans. You can take admission in the General category if your percentage matches with the cut-offs. If you want to take the benefit of any reserved category then you need to have a valid caste certificate.

11. If someone submits the certificate with the wrong name of the mother in DU form, then will he get the admission?

Ans. The name of the candidate, father or mother in any certificate should match with their 10th certificate.

12. What happens if a candidate is unable to provide a caste certificate during admission into a college?

Ans. It is important to submit a caste certificate during admission otherwise the candidate is not eligible to get admission in the reserved category.

13. If I filled my caste as OBC, but I have good marks as a general, can I take admission in the general category?

Ans. Yes, you can.

14. In admission for DU, what is the date of the OBC certificate required?

Ans. OBC-NCL should be of the current financial year (1st April 2021 onwards).

15. Can I register for BSc in DU if my caste certificate application number is issued but my caste certificate is not issued? Can I register with my application number?

Ans. Yes, you can apply but at the time of admission, you have to produce the certificate.

16. How can I register myself for admission to undergraduate courses available at Institute of Home Economics?

Ans. You can register online for all undergraduate courses through the admission portal URL http://admission.du.ac.in & follow the guidelines to proceed.

17. Can I apply in multiple programs/courses in an online form?

Ans. Yes, you may select all programs/courses of your interest through a single online registration form. It is important to note that you can apply in all merit-based as well as entrance based courses through the same online application.

18. Is it possible to change/update the information provided by the applicant in the online application form, once the fee is submitted?

Ans. No, the applicant can't change/update the information once the fee is submitted.

19. How does one apply through the ECA or Sports quota?

Ans. You can apply for the ECA and Sports quota by selecting appropriate options in the registration form.

20. Is it possible to apply under ECA/Sports Category once I have paid my registration fee?

Ans. No, once you have paid the fee, you will not be able to apply under ECA/Sports Category.

21. Will there be any disadvantage for gap year students?

Ans. No, there is no disadvantage for gap year students and they would be treated at par with regular students. They should meet the requisite criteria for admission and must possess the necessary documents/certificates.

22. Will the applicants be given admission on a first-come, first-serve policy after the declaration of cut-offs?

Ans. Admissions in the colleges are not based on first come first serve policy. Instead, the applicant who has filled the online registration form and satisfies the criteria and cut-off for a particular programme/course in a particular college will be considered for admission as per the schedule of admission specified.

23. If my result is awaited, Can I submit the online registration form?

Ans. Yes, you can submit the online registration form by choosing "Awaited" in the drop -down menu of "Result Status" on the "Academic Details" page/section while entering the information. However, you will have to fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria/meeting cut-off list of that course/college during the stipulated period.

24. Does IHE have entrance based admission?

Ans. IHE has a course Bachelors in Elementary Education for which students need to write a centralized entrance exam. For all other UG courses, we have cut off lists.

25. Do I need to send a hard copy of the form?

Ans. No, you don't need to send the hard copy of the form. If required, you will be notified.

26. How can I upload a self-attested ID Proof?

Ans. Take a photocopy of your ID proof; 2. Self-attest it; 3. Scan it and upload.

27. Which are the mandatory fields in the application?

Ans. Mandatory fields are indicated by a red star (*) adjacent to the name of the fields. The applicant must fill the relevant information in these fields to complete the Registration.

28. I have created my account and filled my Application Form on the PG Admission Portal. Can I use the same account to fill the Application Form for my friend?

Ans. No, each applicant/candidate must create a separate account and fill a separate Online Application Form.
