BRIEF REPORT ABOUT THE EVENT: An online awareness campaign was conducted for the students by RMDA department in collaboration with Eco-club 'Prakritik' regarding the ban on sharp manja in NCT of Delhi. Since kite flying is a popular sport amongst young children and students on the festivals of Makar sankranti, Republic Day and Basant Panchmi. But, kite flying threads being non-biodegradable can harm the environment. Moreover these kite-flying made out of plastic, nylon or coated with glass/metallic components can be fatal and can cause a lot of injury to human beings and birds. Therefore, during the classes, teachers shared the harm caused and reiterated to the students regarding the ban on kite-flying made with nylon, plastic etc popularly known as 'Chinese Manja'. Further, it was reinforced that kite flying shall only be permissible only with a cotton thread, free from any sharp/metallic/glass components/adhesives/thread strengthening materials. The notification received from the Department of Environment, Government of NCT of Delhi regarding this was also shared with the students. Discussions were held and students also shared their previous experiences of using the manja made of plastic or glass components.

BRIEF REPORT ABOUT THE EVENT: A poster making competition was conducted for the students by Eco-club 'Prakritik' regarding the water and wetland preservation'.
