

Curriculum Development in Preschool, Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies






Autism Awareness Day, Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies







Certificate Course on Life Skill, Department of Resource Management and Design Application




Certificate Course on Teaching English, Department of Elementary Education


Resume Writing Workshop, Eminence, Placement Cell







Prachi Salve is associated with IndiaSpend, a new media platform that uses open data sources to analyze issues with the aim of fostering better governance, transparency, and accountability in India. Alumnus of the University of Sussex, UK, Mumbai University, and St. Xavsers College, Ms. Salve holds two masters' degrees in economics and development studies. A former research assistant at the Institute of Development Studies (UK) and the Young Foundation (UK), she has also worked with Greenpeace India. At IndiaSpend, Prachi and her colleagues seek to engage with what they call 'critical data' in order to inform citizens in becoming an active part of the governance process. 






Personal Counselling and Mentoring by Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies

Workshop on Puppet Making, Department of Elementary Education











