And

Department of Resource Management and Design Application, Institute of Home Economics, University of Delhi, Hauz Khas, New Delhi.

This comes into effect from the date of signing of MOU

1.1 ISHRAE

- b) DCI and RMDA will encourage their members to work cooperatively on issues of shared interest.
- c) Each organization will pay its own expenses incurred as a result of cooperation or collaboration under the terms of this Memorandum of Understanding. Any sharing of expenses must be agreed to in writing by both parties prior to incurring such expenses.
- d) Both parties recognize the mutually beneficial opportunities through inter-association cooperation in the areas of building brand awareness, increase usage and awareness of course materials for recertification and research development. Wherever possible, both parties resolve to pursue areas of cooperation where joint expertise, resources and research capacity can accelerate progress towards mutual goals.
- e) DCI and RMDA will consider nominating domain experts to one another's Conferences/Seminars to facilitate cross-flow of knowledge. Each organization shall provide news of events and activities to the other organization for possible inclusion in their various publications and online information sources.
- f) DCI and RMDA may plan to jointly organise Awareness & Training Programs in various fields of environment conservation, climate change, Indoor Environmental Quality and more. Both the organisations will consider coming up with joint publications.
- g) Each organization will invite to the top officials of DCI & RMDA at the time of inauguration of each other events
- h) ISHRAE & RMDA will consider sending Speakers with domain expertise to one another's Conferences/Seminars to facilitate cross flow of knowledge.
- i) Each party will invite the President/CEO/Head of the Department/Teacher-in-charge to each other's major conference each year. If the President or CEO or teacher-in-charge is not able to attend, an alternative may be nominated.
- j) Students from RMDA and ISHRAE youth wing will be involved in seminars, internships, conferences and events with a view of knowledge sharing.

3.1 Liaison Committee:

 A liaison Committee comprising a representative of DCI and another representative from RMDA shall hold a meeting, either via Conference call or at any other pre-arranged venue at least once in six months to implement the MoU and explore more Areas of Cooperation. The names of the representatives shall be mutually finalized later.

3.2 Policy Statements and Position Statements

position statements developed on technical subjects. If further collaboration is considered to be

3.4 Govt. Representation & Use of Logos

- This MoU shall not be construed as creating a partnership, joint venture, principal agent or any
 other relationship of any kind between Delhi Chapter of ISHRAE (DCI) and RMDA and both
 are free to exercise judgment & discretion with regard to the conduct of their respective
 businesses.
- RMDA or ISHRAE will not make any representation to any Government/Statutory Body on behalf of each other unless the same has been specifically approved in writing by the competent authorities in the two Associations.
- Neither Party will be held liable for acts of omissions or commission of the other party with respect to anything agreed upon under this MoU. The rights and responsibilities established shall survive indefinitely the termination of this Agreement.
- This MoU recognizes the fact that both RMDA & ISHRAE trademarks are widely known throughout India & Overseas. The association of the ISHRAE trademark with any event brings to that event the benefit of heightened awareness and prestige. The use of ISHRAE trademark has therefore to be authorized by ISHRAE. Indiscriminate use of Logo is prohibited and it is necessary to seek prior approval in writing detailing the context of usage from the other party before using their Logo.

4.0 Tenure and Termination

This MoU between RMDA & DCI shall be valid when signed by the authorized representatives of both parties and shall continue until two years and can be terminated by either party on serving a written thirty days notice to this effect. The MoU may be renewed modified or amended by mutual written consent of both the Associations.


