Extension & outreach activities of the Department

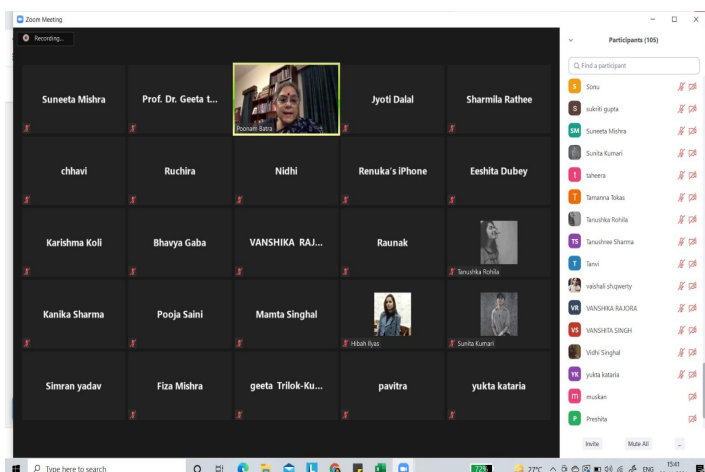
