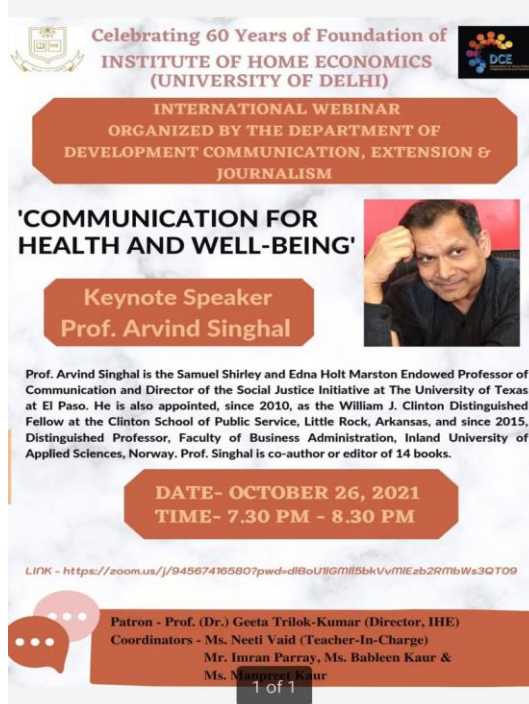
10. Seminar on 'Where Traditional Meets Modern: Communicating through Puppetry.'

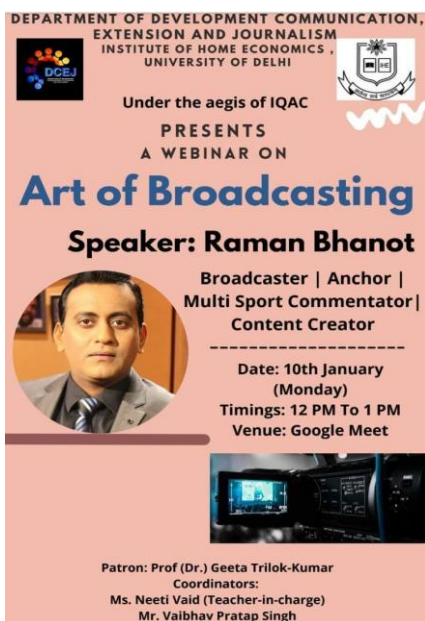
13. Outdoor Photography Workshop 'Chasing Landscapes':

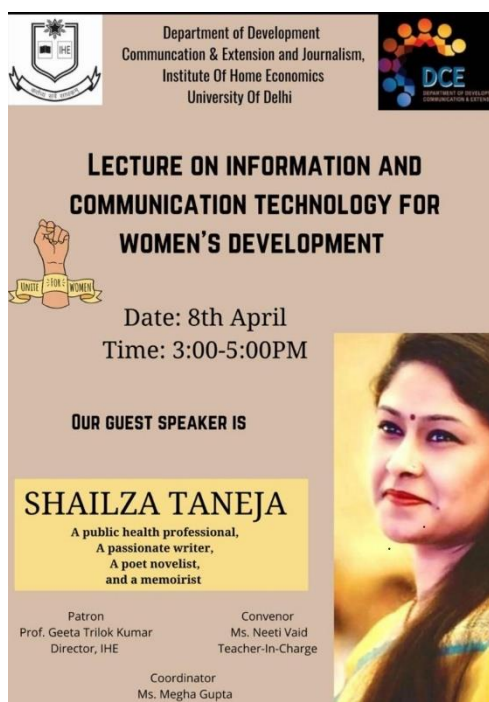

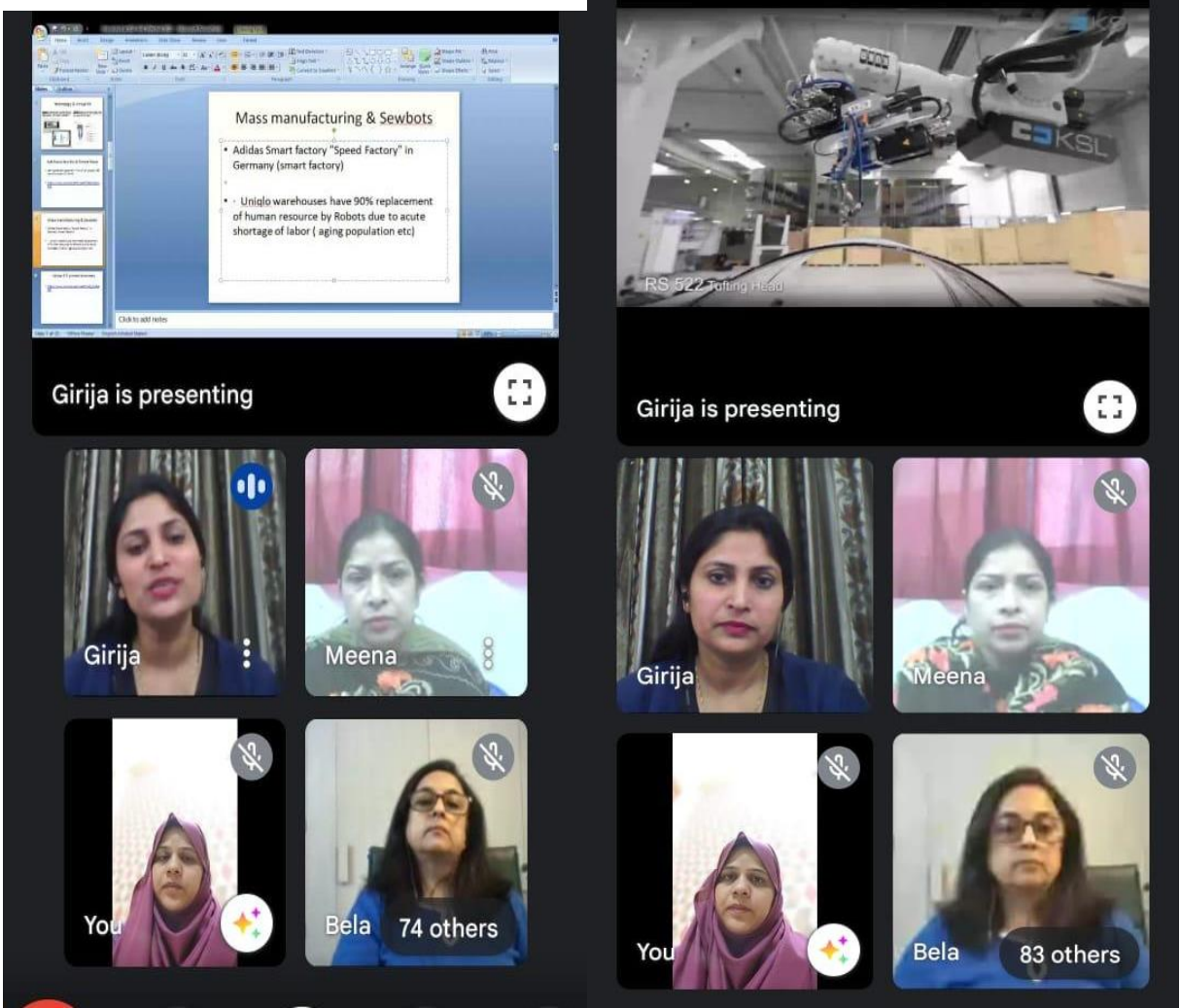


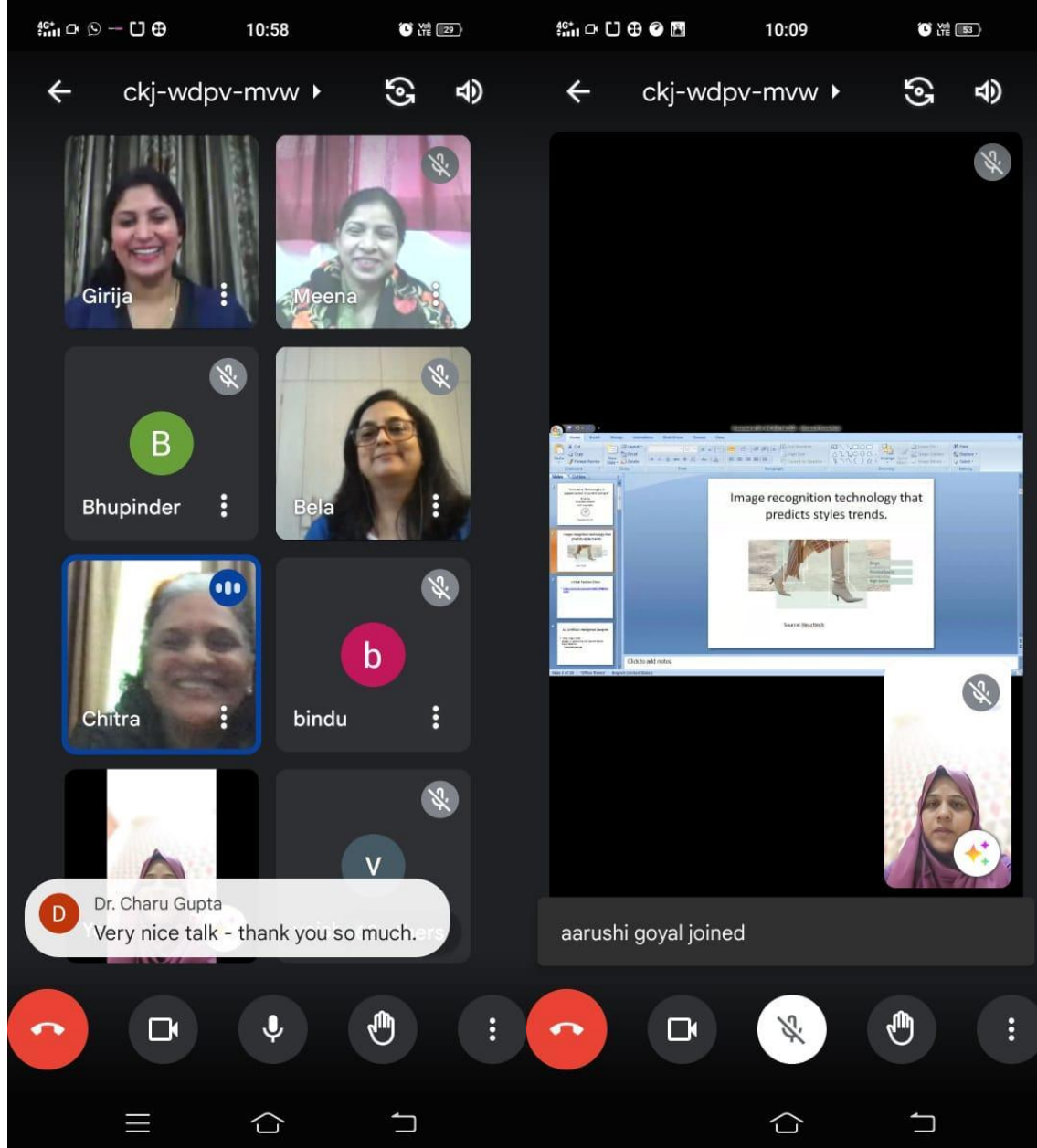
Department of Fabric and Apparel Science organized a Technical talk on 26th February 2022 on “**Innovative technologies in apparel sector in current context**” the Technical talk was conducted online mode and speaker was Mrs. Girija Jha. This Technical talk was coordinated by Dr. Meena Batham, Dr. Shazia Mehtab teaching in the Institute of Home Economics. Approximately 70 students participated in this technical talk Mrs. Girija Jha is currently an associate professor in the department of Fashion technology at NIFT Delhi. Her expertise lies in garment manufacturing technology and sustainability. With almost two decades of experience in academia and industry, she is currently working in the domain of sustainability.

The purpose of the Technical talk is to impart knowledge about new technologies existing in the garment industry sector and new sustainable way outs of production.

The purpose of the talk was to sensitize and motivate students to explore the field of new technologies. Today, the textiles & apparel sector is one of the largest contributors to India’s exports and second largest employer after Agriculture. Apparel manufacturing alone, currently provides employment to a population of 12.3 million. In the last couple of years the growth rate of India is decreasing because of less technological advancement. Garment manufacturing industry is highly labor intensive and in India it is fragmented (with mostly small and mid-sized factories) driven by individual entrepreneurial spirit, leading to limited technological advancement and investment. It is recommended to design a standard factory grading system based on current technology level. Based on factories’ current rating and willingness to improve their rating, government may provide subsidies/incentives. Also, it is suggested that ERP Software is covered under TUFS to ensure efficient process management at production floor. To ensure that India stays ahead in terms of Technological advancement, it has been suggested that the

curriculum for Robotics/Pneumatics be introduced for Garment Manufacturing Technology courses.

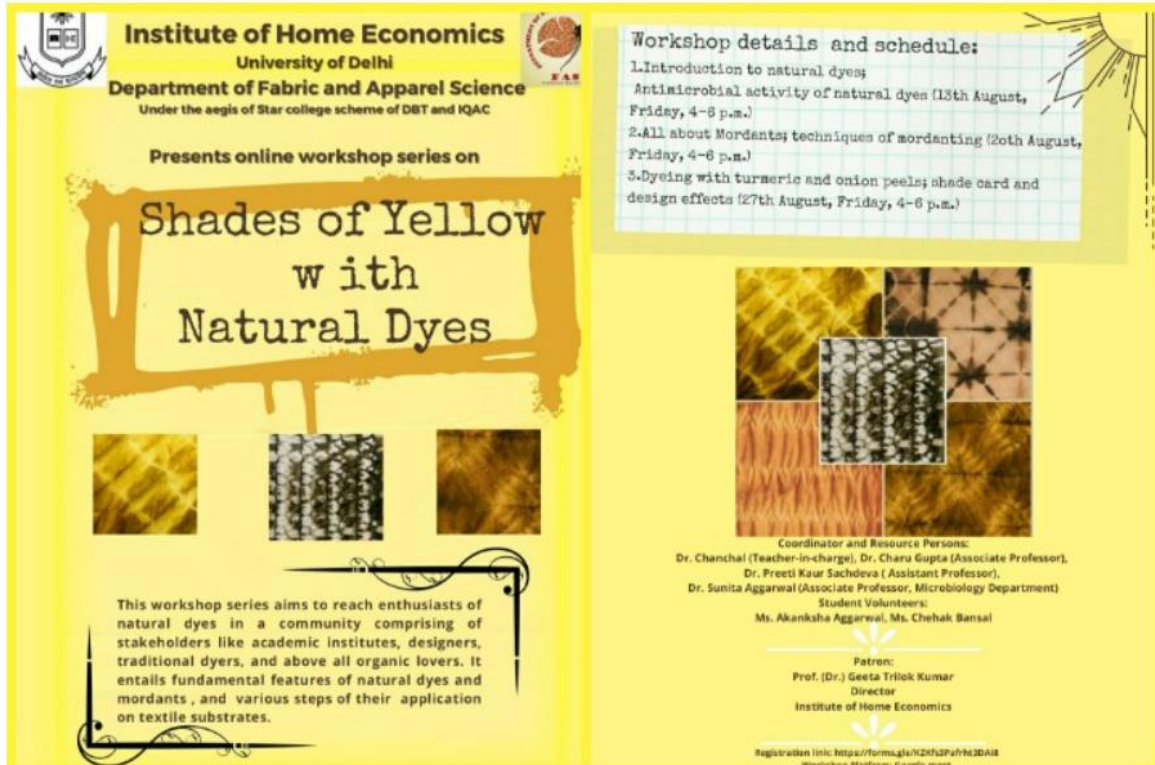

Workshop series: Shades of Yellow with Natural Dyes

The Department of Fabric and Apparel Science, Institute of Home Economics, University of Delhi, conducted an online workshop series on **‘Shades of Yellow with Natural Dyes’** in August’21 (13th, 20th and 27th August, 4:00- 6:00 pm.) under the aegis of Star college scheme of DST and IQAC. The workshop was conducted under the patronship of Prof. (Dr.) Geeta Trilok Kumar (Director, Institute of Home Economics) and guidance of Dr.Chanchal (Teacher-in-charge, Department of Fabric and Apparel Science). The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Charu Gupta (Associate Professor), Dr. Preeti Kaur Sachdeva (Assistant Professor) and Dr. Sunita Aggarwal (Associate Professor, Department of Microbiology). The student volunteers for the workshop series were Ms. Aakanksha Agrawal (PhD Scholar) and Ms. Chehak Bansal.



The workshop series aimed to reach the enthusiasts of natural dyes in a community comprising of stake holders like academic institutes, designers, traditional dyers and lovers of organic eco- friendly things. It entails fundamental features of natural dyes and mordants along with explaining the various steps involved in their application on textile substrates.

The objective of this workshop series was to explain how one can easily dye fabrics in beautiful shades of yellow at home with material easily available in every household. Thus, the application of two natural dyes was explored in depth – Onion peel dye and Turmeric. The bio-mordants used were also easily procurable – alum (phitkari), harad and aloe vera. To achieve varied colour palette metal mordants were also used like ferrous sulphate, aluminium sulphate.

The participants were students from Institute of Home Economics (of undergraduate and post graduate level) as well as people from outside the college (Pearl Academy, Amity University, Dayalbagh Educational Institute and some freelance designers). All the participants took part in the workshop series actively, by preparing samples at home using different tie and dye techniques and making a shade card of samples dyed and mordanted with different compounds.

The first session (13th August) was given by Dr. Charu Gupta on natural dyes. The participants were given a basic understanding of natural dyes and mordants. It was followed by a session giving an overview of antimicrobial property possessed by many natural dyes. It was given by Dr. Sunita Aggarwal. Followed the two presentations, Dr. Preeti Kaur Sachdeva explained the ingredients required for the upcoming two sessions. The first session was attended by 41 participants. The participants were given a list of materials for mordanting and dyeing at home.

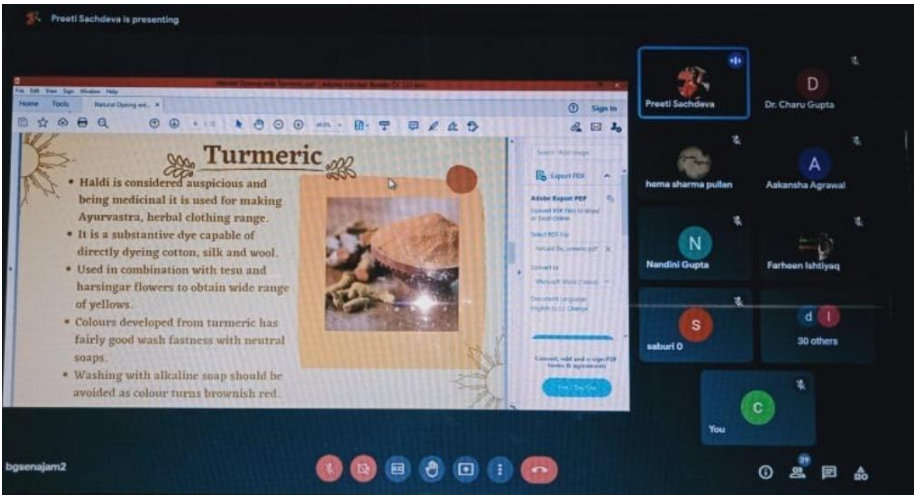
The next session (on 20th August) was given by Dr. Charu Gupta. She thoroughly explained the preparation treatments needed for fabric before dyeing/mordanting and the different mordanting procedures that can be used. In the next sessions, natural dyes extracted from onion peel and turmeric powder were discussed by Aakanksha Agrawal and Dr. Preeti Kaur Sachdeva. 40 participants attended the session. The procedures of dyeing with these dyes were explained in detail so that participants could easily try it at home.

In the final sessions on 27th August, some participants presented the dying they had been able to do at their home. They also developed a shade card for the dyes. It was followed by a demo session on different tie and dye and shibori techniques by Ms. Chehak Bansal. It was followed by a session on ‘machine tritik’ technique of tie and dye, given by Dr. Vandana Jaglan (Principal, Satyam Fashion Institute). The results that can be obtained by all those techniques were also shown. 41 participants attended the last session. Certificate of participation was provided to all the participants.




Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies in collaboration with Breakthrough presented a webinar series on “Bystander Intervention on Sexual Harassment from, October from 12th to 14th, 2021. The students were introduced to the speaker, Ms. Shipy Singh. She briefed the students about Breakthrough and highlight some the initiatives organized by the organisation, with 20 years of experience in combating violence against women and girls in Delhi, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Jharkhand. The session started with Ms. Singh sharing her own experience of growing up in Delhi NCR. She talked how she had to move to a PG in order to avoid putting up eve teasing etc on daily basis. She also emphasised on taking a break to relax if at any point the students feel overwhelmed with emotions during the session while discussing their own personal experiences. She also encouraged students to share such incidents with all, if they are comfortable. Furthermore students can also reach out to her by private via text. She went on to present recent data on along with describing sexual harassment. The astonishing results presented showed the prevalence of sexual harassment as worldwide phenomenon.

The session helped the students with opening up their experiences with help of multiple choice questions on forms of sexual harassment they have experienced. She also talked about the fact that incidents like these leave a lasting impression on the person. She then asked the reasons about while people choose to ignore and not act while witnessing an incident of sexual harassment and what are their concerns about intervening. The students came up with many reasons ranging from ignorance, fear to none of my business etc. Ms. Singh then talked about the five very important interventions with help of videos produced with the help of L’Oreal Paris to emphasis on these points , with first being distract , delegate, document , delay and direct. She also asked the students which ones they are going to use at the time of witnessing sexual harassment. She reinforced that the fact that it is very critical to notice the scenario and assess your own safety before you decide to intervene and use one of the 5Ds that works for you.

Ms. Singh also talked about the importance of practising resilience in order to reclaim your own space that the harasser is trying to take control of. The sense of power that the harasser derives from the act promotes such kind of behaviour. Responding at the right time and trusting one's instincts helps to reclaim the power and reduce the trauma associated with harassment. In the end she also shared emergency helpline numbers in India along with the contact details of some of the local organizations working in the area of harassment, violence, abuse, suicide and psycho-social disabilities.

The interactive session proved to be an eye opener to the students and generated a lot of questions in their minds. The sessions emphasized the importance of standing up not just for oneself but also for other people. As soon as the session was opened for questions, there were many questions ranging from trauma associated with harassment, to social stigma, to lack of public sensitivity. The session ended with faculty extending thanks to the esteemed speaker for some valuable insights with the students.

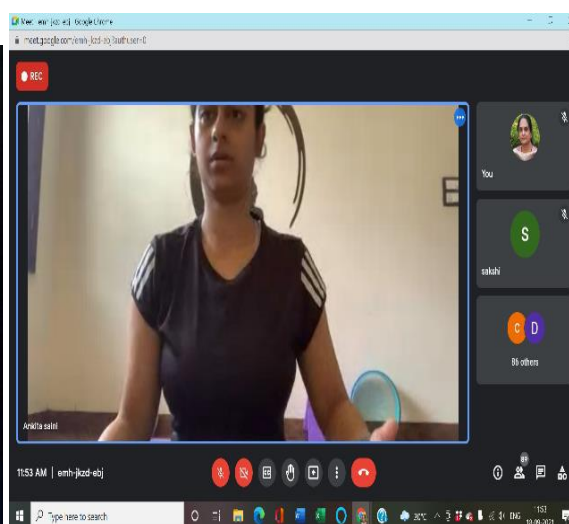
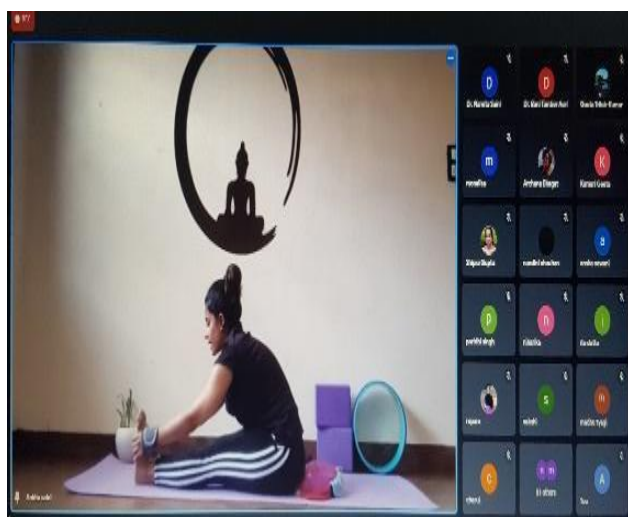
In addition to this talk, a quiz competition was also conducted on Reproductive Health. About 40 students participated in the competition and the winners were awarded with trophies and cash prizes.

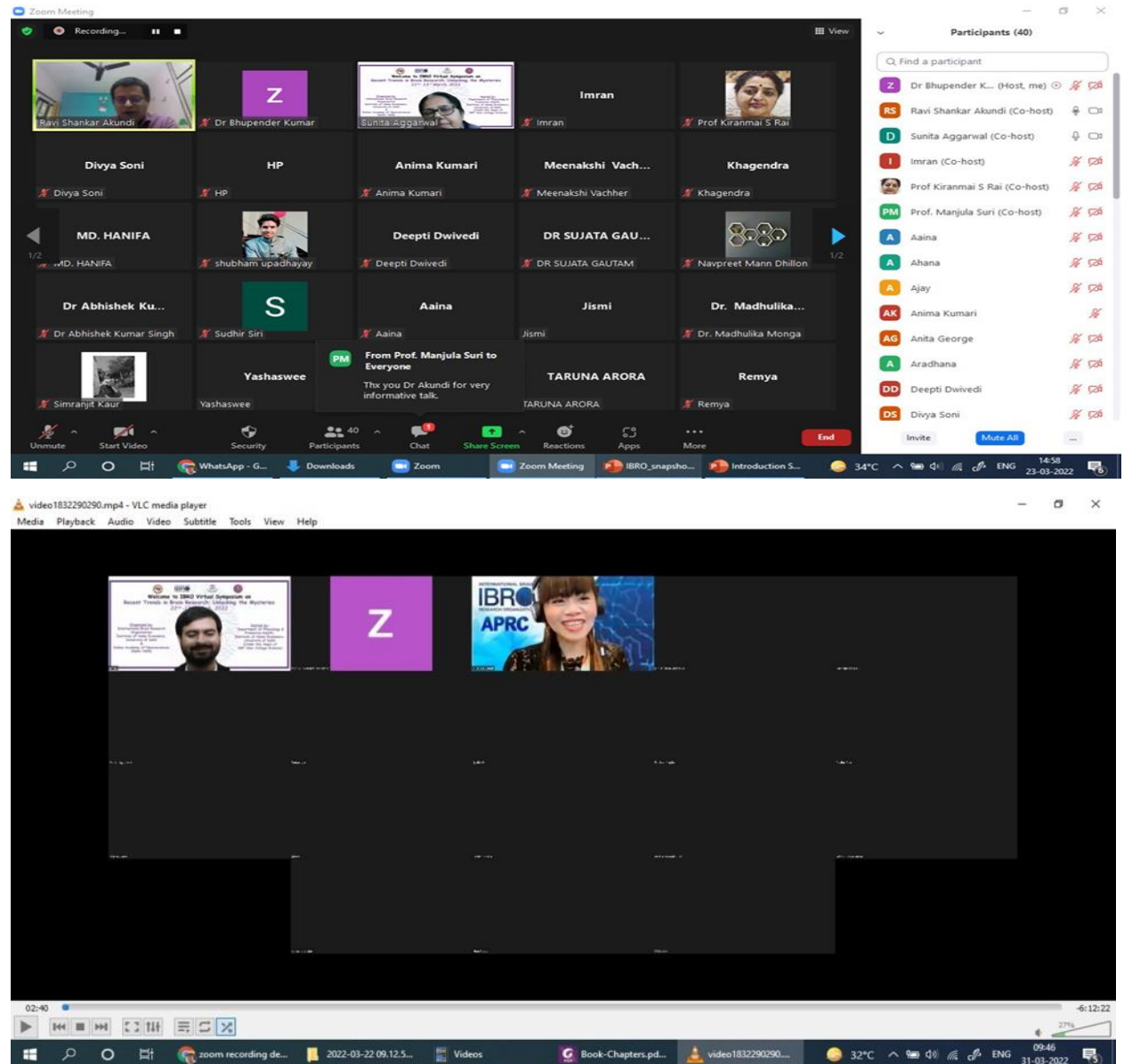
