2.3.3 AARAMBH Early Child Development Centre

Aarambh, the Early Child Development Centre endeavours to provide a core promising space for child care, nurturing and development. Aarambh offers a range of services such as preschool, creche and daycare and after-school programmes. It caters to both college staff and neighbourhood community.

Summer Camp at AARAMBH

A three-week summer camp was organized for children in the age group of 3-12 years from 22nd May 2023 to 10th June 2023. The summer camp aimed at providing opportunities for holistic development for children. Storytelling sessions facilitated by Dr. Krishnaveni Achary provided opportunities for enhancing language skills and stimulating imagination. Sessions with Ms. Ruchi aimed at enhancing numeracy and mathematical

skills in a creative and engaging way. Activities carried out by Dr. Sneha gave opportunities to children to freely express themselves through arts. Activities were also carried out to enhance familiarity with the natural environment through nature trails, potting the plants, and creating a miniature garden.
