ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Founded in 1961, the Institute of Home Economics (IHE), is a premier college of the University of Delhi imparting education to women. ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

As countries strive towards meeting the SDGs by 2030, it is apparent that the progress across the globe is uneven. As per estimates, only 16% targets of SDGs are well on track and the countries are still working towards meeting the rest. India has made significant progress in achieving SDGs as well as the vision of Viksit Bharat by 2047. However, major challenges remain in areas of health and well-being, nutrition, education, sanitation and housing. Health and well-being of populations are threatened by environmental hazards including climate related crisis, increased illnesses due to mircobial threats, anti-microbial resistance as well as gender-based inequalities in society. This hinder progress and deepen the existing social and economic disparities in societies. This conference envisages to focus on the intersections between the themes of gender, environmental hazards, health-related concerns and challenges in society which are often exacerbated by climatic changes and extremes. It aims to delve deep into creating understanding of the critical relationships between the triple domains of environmental challenges, issues of gender equality as well as health and well-being of populations.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

ABSTRACT

- Abstract length should be 250-300 words with 4-5 keywords.
- Thematic area should be clearly mentioned.
- Font: Times New Roman, 12 size, space 1.5.
- Abstract will be selected by the scientific committee.
- Authors whose abstracts are selected must submit full length papers (1500-2000 words) which will be published in conference proceedings with ISBN number subject to registration in the conference.

FULL PAPER

- Paper should be submitted as a MS Word file (PDF not accepted).
- Language used should be clear, concise and coherent.
- All the tables and figures must be inserted in the text document.
- All the citations should be at the end of the paper in APA format.
- An early submission of the abstract/full paper will be highly appreciated.
- Certificates shall be provided to all registered participants and presenters.
- Online participants will get e-certificates.

Best Paper Awards will be given in both oral and poster presentation under both thematic areas
